A note from the Executive Director: Summer 2024
Summer has arrived and CILWW staff are busy! All three CILWW programs, Personal Assistant Services (PAS), New Freedom Transportation (NF), and Independent Living (IL) have been busy with outreach activities and training. One of those outreach activities has been working with the new homeless shelter in Menomonie operated by Stepping Stones of Dunn County, and

meeting with consumers at the shelter to provide resources on the services CILWW offers. The PAS staff recently completed training with our caregivers and worked with UW Eau Claire on a basic sign language class. NF is gearing up for the annual volunteer driver training in October at the St. Croix Casino in Turtle Lake. IL has been busy providing services and staff have been busy working on a Sex Education curriculum and working with area high schools to offer the course to Pre-ETS students.

In April, staff from CILWW attended the Aging, Disability, and Independent Living conference in Lacrosse. It was a good conference with a variety of workshops and provided a great opportunity to network with staff from the Aging and Disability Resource Centers, Independent Living Centers, and members from the Department of Health Services disability councils. I am looking forward to the next one. On July 16, CILWW will be hosting the Caravan for Disability Rights and Justice as it makes its way across the US in celebration of the 34th anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act. This will be an "open house" event at CILWW from 11 am to 3 pm. More information on the event will be available on the CILWW website.

Finally, I would like to take the opportunity to thank Leslie Fijalkiewicz, who has served on the CILWW since March 2021. As the Chippewa County ADRC Director, Leslie brought years of experience working with older adults and persons with disabilities and provided valuable insight and knowledge to the board. 

Assistive Technology Corner



Assistive Technology Demonstration & Loan Program

WisTech is Wisconsin's Assistive Technology (AT) program. AT is a device or service that allows people to function as independently as possible at home, school, work, and in the community. CILWW is a regional AT Device and Demonstration Center. CILWW has almost 2,000 different AT devices that we can loan and/or demonstrate to people. CILWW staff can bring devices to people's homes, answer questions about devices, loan devices for a short period of time, give vendor and funding resources, and use their experience to help find the most cost effective options.

Check out our new assistive technology devices!





CILWW is featuring the Fiber Grasp Hominid X tool. This versatile grasping device is specifically designed for individuals who may have hand weakness or paralysis. It is recommended for those who have range of motion in their shoulder and elbow but lack strength in their hands. The Fiber Grasping tool is intended to assist with everyday tasks, hobbies, and personal care needs. It is capable of securely grasping objects up to the weight of a 1.5L water bottle.

This wearable device can be easily adjusted to accommodate various hand sizes. The design functions as a supportive frame around the user's hand, aiding in the natural closure around objects. The Fiber Grasp utilizes spring-loaded cable mechanisms instead of costly electronic components, making it a

more budget-friendly option compared to other high-end devices. This product is exclusively available for purchase online through Hominid X at a retail price of \$99.00.

CILWW offers the opportunity for individuals to borrow or try out items mentioned in our articles before making a purchase. Schedule an appointment to try a variety of equipment with one-on-one assistance from knowledgeable and experienced staff!

TEPP

Staff can also help you apply for funding through TEPP:
Telecommunications Equipment Purchase Program. Money collected through
WI telephone service providers goes into the WI Universal Service Fund,
which pays for TEPP. CILWW's role is to help you access the funding you
need to get the equipment you need!



Loan Programs

WisLoan offers loans to help people buy assistive technology or equipment such as modified vehicles, wheelchairs, and ramps. There are no income requirements and individuals are not required to exhaust personal or public funding. Under the program, banks provide loans at a fixed interest rate of 6.5% to qualified borrowers. Loan amounts depend on the item and ability to repay.

Telework is a loan program that allows residents with disabilities to purchase computers and other equipment needed to work from home or from other remote sites away from the office, such as work on the road or at a Telework center.
